MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Church Family,

Politics. Sigh. You can't live with it, and you can't live without it. It seems to run every part of lives. It does not help that we are presently in the throes of a presidential election. Signs are in yards. Partisan ads flow on TV and YouTube like Niagara Falls. Political opponents attack each other. Even citizens take their place in the opposite corners of the political boxing ring, bracing to pummel each other. The picture often resembles a mud mix smeared on a canvas. Not pretty.

Politics. How should we Christians live in relation to it? As much as we would like to avoid getting dirty in the political sandbox, it is not an option for Christians. Scripture teaches us that Christians are to think and act like a Christian in all things. This includes politics. There is no divide between one's "private" faith and "public" life.

Scripture teaches us several things about how to interact in the political sphere. First, it commands us to pray for every governing authority. Paul instructed his young protégé, Timothy, "I urge that entreaties and prayers, petitions and thanksgivings, be made on behalf of all men, for kings and all who are in authority" (1 Tim 2:1-2a; NASB). Note that Paul does not say to pray only for your political party or preferred candidate. It says to pray for all who are in authority. This means you may be praying for people whom you dislike or who are promoting evil.

Second, Scripture teaches why we are praying for them. Paul continues, "... so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity. This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim 2:2b-4). In other words, we are to pray for all the governing authorities so that we can live the Christian life and spread the Gospel. God desires for every person to be saved, and He wants the governing authorities to permit the Gospel to be

preached and lived out. As such, Christians are to promote religious freedom and for the state to avoid entanglement with the church.

Scripture also teaches that Christians are to exhort governments to protect the innocent and bring justice to the evildoer. Romans 13:3 states that "rulers are not a cause of fear for good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good and you will have praise from the same." God created government to protect the innocent and those who are lawabiding citizens. In fact, Romans 13:4 continues on to state this succinctly: "for it is a minister of God to you for good." Then, on the other hand, for the lawbreaker, the state "does not bear the sword for nothing; for it is a minister of God, an avenger who brings wrath on the one who practices evil." God designed the sphere of government to protect innocent law abiders and bring justice upon criminals.

When we consider, therefore, how Christians ought to understand and interact with politics, we need to remember that we are to pray for governing officials. We need to pray that they will allow religious freedom for the spread of the Gospel and so that we can live peaceful lives. Furthermore, Christians are to promote not just religious freedom but candidates who understand that the primary governmental responsibility is to serve justice.

As we continue in this political season, we may be tempted to "sit out" and remain uninvolved. For Christians, however, this is not an option. We must pray about and promote what Scripture teaches concerning governing authorities. It may be messy, but whoever said living the Christian life would be easy?




This past month we started off our school year with Thrive.

Please pray for our teens as we move forward.




